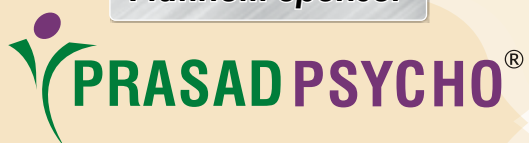

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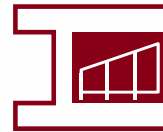

***Publication of Papers:*** Out of all the invited talks and scientific papers, 30 best papers would be selected by the academic committee which would be further reviewed and edited in required manner. Subsequently it would be published in the edited book carrying ISBN number in association with a publisher of national and international repute. The other terms and conditions in this regard would be laid by the organizing committee.







**1. Manju Thakur Memorial Oration Award**

This award is instituted by Dr. Archana Thakur, Joint Secretary, U.G.C. in memory of her mother to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar for delivering a special lecture on any contemporary issue of Health and Well-being. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

**2. Anita Memorial Oration Award:**

This award is instituted by Prof. Anand Kumar, President, IAHP in the memory of his beloved wife. The award is to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar who has carried out an innovative work in the area of health and well-being. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

**3. Dr. Lalit Kumar Vaya Behavioural Health Scientist Award:**

This award is instituted by Prof. S.L.Vaya, Life Time Professor, Rashtriya Raksha University, Gandhinagar, Gujarat in the name of her husband. The award is to be conferred at the International Conference of IAHP every year to an eminent scholar who has carried out an innovative work in the applied aspect of health psychology. The scholar for this award will be nominated by the President, Indian Academy of Health Psychology.

## **Awards for all Applicants Participating in the 10<sup>th</sup> ICIAHP - 2025:**

**1. G.P.Thakur Young Scientist Award:**

A special session for the young scientist award will be organised for young researchers and scholars (age up to 35 years as on 30th September, 2025). Paper should be single authored only and a self- declaration to the effect that the paper has neither been presented in any forum nor been published in any form is a mandatory requirement. The papers received for this session will be reviewed by a screening committee and based on the quality and significance of the research, only 05 papers will be selected for presentation in the IAHP young scientist award session and remaining papers will be considered for presentation in the relevant scientific sessions.

**2. IAHP Best Paper Award:**

Best paper award will be organised for researchers and scholars (age up to 45 years as on 15th September, 2024). Paper should be single authored only and a self-declaration to the effect that the paper has neither been presented in any forum nor been published in any form is a mandatory requirement. The papers received for this session will be reviewed by a screening committee and based on the quality and significance of the research, only 05 papers will be selected for presentation in the Best paper award session and remaining paper will be considered for presentation in the relevant scientific sessions. The results will be declared and the citation of IAHP Best Paper award will be presented to the awardee at the valedictory session of the conference.

## Places to visit in Jaipur

### Hawa Mahal (*Distance from venue: 8.6 km, 20 minute*)

Hawa Mahal, Jaipur's iconic “Palace of Winds,” is a five-storey beehive-like structure with numerous windows and jharokhas that keep it airy and breezy throughout. The Hawa Mahal is a five-storey building, and it is the tallest building in the world that has been built without a foundation. It has a curved architecture that leans at an 87 degree angle, and a pyramidal shape which has helped it stay erect for centuries.



### The City Palace (*Distance from venue: 8.8km, 22 minute*)

Located in Jaipur's walled city, the City Palace Complex was built by Maharaja Sawai Jai Singh II and later expanded by successors. A blend of Mughal and Rajput architecture, it remains home to the royal family. Key attractions include Mubarak Mahal, now a museum showcasing royal costumes and textiles, and the Maharani's Palace, featuring 15th-century Rajput weaponry and ornate ceiling paintings.

### Jal Mahal (*Distance from venue: 13.2 km, 30 minute*)

Jal Mahal, or the “Water Palace,” is a stunning five-storey palace set in the middle of Man Sagar Lake. Built in red sandstone, four of its floors remain submerged when the lake is full, leaving only the top visible. With its Rajput and Mughal design, the palace creates a magical sight, especially at sunrise and sunset.



### Albert Hall Museum (*Distance from venue: 7.7km, 17 minutes*)

Albert Hall Museum, inspired by London's Victoria and Albert Museum, is Jaipur's oldest museum located in Ram Niwas Garden. Designed in Indo-Saracenic style, it showcases metalware, wood crafts, carpets, ivory, sculptures, and miniature paintings from Rajasthan's famous art schools.



## Places to visit in Jaipur

### **Nahargarh Fort (Distance from venue: 23km, 50 minute)**

**Nahargarh Fort**, meaning “**abode of tigers**,” crowns the Aravalli Hills and was built by Maharaja Jai Singh in 1734. Later expanded, a summer retreat with mural-adorned suites for the king and his queens. A favorite picnic spot today, the fort offers panoramic views of Jaipur, dazzling especially when lit up at night.



### **Amber Palace (Distance from venue: 17 km, 40 minute)**

Amer Fort, one of Jaipur's top attractions, stands on a hill about 8.6 km from the venue. Built with pale yellow and pink sandstone and white marble, it features four main sections with courtyards. Highlights include the Diwan-e-Aam, Sheesh Mahal, Sila Devi Mandir, and restored tunnels linking it to Jaigarh Fort. A fine example of Rajasthani architecture, Amer Fort is a must-visit.



### **Khatu Shyam Ji (Distance from venue: 104 km 2hr)**

**Khatu Shyam Ji**, revered as the “**Deity of Kaliyuga**,” is worshipped as a manifestation of Lord Krishna. Known as “**Hare Ka Sahara**” (support of the defeated), devotees believe that simply remembering his name removes sorrows and fulfills wishes.



### **Shri Mehandipur Balaji Temple (Distance from venue: 106 km, 2 hrs.)**

**Salasar Balaji**, located in the Churu district of Rajasthan, is a famous temple dedicated to Lord Hanuman. Revered as “**Balaji Maharaj**,” the temple is a major pilgrimage site where devotees come to seek blessings for strength, protection, and the fulfillment of wishes.
